



Camp Packing List – Culinary Entrée/Prix Fixe

Masks:

- 14 cloth masks (masks are required)
- Small mesh lingerie laundry bag (suggested to make sure masks aren't lost in the wash)

Bedding:

- 2 sets of linens (twin-size top sheet, bottom, sheet, and pillowcases)
- 1 blanket
- 1 pillow
- 1 sleeping bag for campouts

Daily Apparel:

- 4 pairs of jeans or long pants
- 10 pairs of shorts
- 10 t-shirts/tank tops
- 3 long sleeve tees
- 15 pairs of socks
- 10 pairs of underwear
- 4 nicer outfits for Shabbat and final Banquet (khaki shorts and collared shirt, skirt/sundress, or whatever comfortable in)
- 4 pairs of pajamas
- 4 sweatshirts
- 1 jacket
- 1 rain poncho
- 1 pairs of sneakers
- 3 bathing suits
- 1 bathing suit cover up (optional)
- 5 towels (3 for showers, 2 for pool/lake)
- Washcloth (optional)
- 1 hat with brim
- 1 pair of sunglasses

Footwear:

- 2 pairs of sneakers
- 1 pair of rain boots or rainy day shoes
- 1 pair of sandals or special footwear for Shabbat/Banquet
- 1 pair of flip flops for the showers

Toiletries:

- Shower caddy
- Shampoo
- Conditioner
- Soap or body wash (1 bar of soap per Entrée)

- Toothbrush
- Toothpaste (1 tube per Entrée)
- Deodorant
- Hairbrush or comb
- Sunscreen (1 bottle per week)
- Insect repellent
- Shaving cream
- Razors
- Tissues
- Tampon, pads, panty liners
- Laundry bag
- Q-tips

Miscellaneous/Optional Items:

- Stationery, stamps, and pens
- Books
- Flashlight and batteries
- Clip-on or small fan
- String bag
- Water bottle
- Battery operated reading light
- Games to play with the group (jacks, cards, UNO, etc.)

Optional Items (Electronics):

Please note that if an electronic is not on the list then it is not allowed at camp. We encourage you to think if your child really needs these items. Camp is a great place to disconnect from the world of electronics and enjoy human relationships, the environment, and lots of great new activities. Most of us have had times in our lives where we lived without these kinds of electronics (in many cases because they weren't invented yet). Camp may well be the opportunity in our children's lives to experience living without these devices. Also, please remember that camp cannot be responsible for any lost, stolen, or broken equipment that is sent to camp.

- MP3 players with no wifi capability and with any videos removed
- Digital cameras or other cameras - as long as no pictures are taken inside of cabins, tents, shower houses, or hotel rooms. Cameras used for those purposes will be confiscated.

Things to Not Bring to Camp:

- Food - We will have lots of good food at camp and plenty of it. Food in cabins attracts critters and can also harm children with food allergies. We want children to enjoy the wildlife at camp, but we don't want it in their bunks/shacks or cabins. Please do not send any food, candy, gum, drinks, or other food stuffs to camp.
- Drugs, Alcohol, and Tobacco - No alcohol, tobacco products, drug or controlled substances are allowed at camp. Any camper violating this rule will be dismissed immediately.
- Cell Phones and Electronics Not On the Optional List - Cell phones, smartphones, digital video players, e-readers (Kindle, Nook, etc), tablets (iPad, Amazon Fire, iPod Touch, etc), laptops, video games and video cameras and any other electronics not on the list above are not allowed

at camp. Any device that is equipped with a Wi-Fi connection or 3g/4g data connection is NOT permitted at camp. All tablets, smartphones, the iPod Touch and e-readers fall into this category. Please check your child's belongings to make sure they have not packed any of these devices.

- Hot Pots and Hot Plates - Hot pots and hot plates are not allowed at camp. When children have brought hot pots to camp, they ended up with second or third degree burns. Please do not send hot pots.
- Animals and Cars - No animals or cars are allowed in camp.
